Logical Awareness: (35 Marks): Syllogism, Analogies, Coding-Decoding, Blood Relations, Direction Sense Test, Logical Sequence of Words, Number Series, Letter Series, Alphanumeric Series, Cause and Effect, Statement and Assumption, Statement and Conclusion, Statement and Argument, Course of Action, Ranking and Order, Calendar Problems, Clock Problems, Decision Making, Puzzle Test.
