In addition to this, the University urgently requires additional funds of Rs. 15000 lakhs in supplementary grants for the financial year 2026-27 to meet out the requirements of the University with regard to the salary & other charges, procurement of hard and soft infrastructure to align with the National Education Policy 2020, a significant project endorsed by the Prime Minister of India, Up-gradation of labs with state-of-the-art equipment to elevate research capabilities in various disciplines, keeping pace with market trends, Construction of a Teaching Block-8, Mechanical Engineering Workshop, Nursing Block and two additional hostels (Boys and Girls) etc. to accommodate the growing student strength due to introduction of new programmes etc.

Resolved that the above recommendations and approval of the Finance Committee be approved and recommended to the University Court.

Further, the House also resolved that the State Govt. be requested to grant more financial assistance to meet out the requirement of the University.

4. **Noted** the Annual Accounts for the year 2024-2025 and Annual Audit Report from 2020-2021 to 2022-2023 of Guru Jambheshwar University of Science & Technology, Hisar.

The Finance Committee considered the above item vide resolution No. 4 in its meeting held on 19.03.2026 and recommended to the Executive Council and University Court as under :-

The Director, CDOE apprised the committee that the Study Centres are demanding to increase their fee share from the present 40% to 50%, excluding examination fee, registration fee, alumni fee. It was also brought to the notice of the committee that prior to the year 2016, 50% fee share was to be given to the Study Centres by the University for Computer and Management related courses. The Director, CDOE stated that the Study Centres emphasized that they need to retain their fee share to meet essential expenditures such as Checking and evaluation of assignments, Conduct of Personal Contact Programmes (PCP) classes & Payment of remuneration to Learner Support Centre (LSC)/Study Centre Coordinators. In this regard, due to following reasons, the current circumstances are not in favour of CDOE, GJUST: -

- (i) Numbers of new private Universities have opened surrounding the National Capital Region along with new state funded Universities in Haryana because of which the clientele of GJUST has decreased.
- (ii) Private Universities as well as state leading Universities are used to give huge commission or incentive to the third parties for promoting their ODL & Online Programmes.
- (iii) Both state Universities i.e. Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra and Maharshi Dayanand University, Rohtak have their academic territory (Affiliated colleges) in nearly twenty districts of Haryana, whereas our University have affiliated Colleges in Hisar District only. That's why these Universities try to restrict other district's affiliated colleges to be Learner Support Centre (LSC)/Study Centres of GJUST Hisar.
- (iv) The IGNOU has also opened the Learner Support Centre (LSC)/Study Centres nearly in each leading Colleges of different Districts of Haryana and neighbouring States.
- (v) Earlier, the number of seats in MBA & MCA programme were not restricted by AICTE in the Learner Support Centre (LSC)/Study Centres. But now the number of admission have been restricted up to three times of AICTE approved seats of MBA & MCA regular programme in conventional mode of the University.

Further, on observation of Executive Council, the committee was also informed that delay in refund/release of the fee share by the University has been a persistent issue, which may demotivate Study Centres from actively participating in admissions for CDOE programmes. That's why Study Centre should retain their fee share as per early practices.

After detailed discussion, the Director, CDOE, GJUST Hisar, proposed that the fee share of Study Centres be increased to 50%, as requested by the Study Centres, to address their financial & operational concerns and to strengthen the admission process of CDOE programmes. Therefore, the Committee recommended unanimously to revise the following Clause of Consolidated Guidelines for the Study Centre as under:-

The TA/DA and honorarium (Rs. 4000/- per member) of members of inspection committee shall be borne by the respective Study Centre every year except first year.	After receipt of Continuation fee of Rs. 10,000/- of respective year, an inspection committee constituted by the Director, CDOE/ the Vice-Chancellor will visit the Study Centre in every two years to inspect requisite staff, infrastructure and other facilities. The TA/DA and honorarium (Rs. 4000/- per member) of members of inspection committee shall be borne by the respective Study Centre.

However, the Committee is also of the view that total revenue of the University should not decrease because of increase in the fee share of the Learner Support Centres (LSCs)/Study Centres. Therefore, the Committee propose 20% increase in the tuition fees of all programmes of Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE) for which share of Study Centre is being increased to 50%.

Remaining guidelines will remain same.

**Resolved that the above proposal be approved.**

38. **Considered** and approve the recommendation of the Committee constituted by the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor in approving the Revised Guidelines of Marketing Channel Partners (MCP) from the next academic session (2026-27).

The Director, CDOE apprised the committee that the Study Centres of CDOE have requested to allow them to act as Marketing Channel Partners (MCP) without security money as they are unable to admit those students which programmes are not available in their College through conventional mode. Moreover, Marketing Channel Partners (MCPs) are also demanding to increase their incentive from the present 30% (for ODL/Online Certificate & One year Diploma Programme) & 35% (for ODL & Online mode Degree Programme) to 50%, excluding examination fee, registration fee, alumni fee as the almost amount of their incentive is spent in the rent of building, salary of employee and advertisement of CDOE Programmes.

After detailed discussion, the Director, CDOE, GJUST Hisar, proposed that the incentive be increased by 10%, as requested by the MCPs. Therefore, the Committee recommended unanimously to modify the Guidelines of MCPs from the next academic session (2026-27) as under:-

**Existing Clause:**

2. The Marketing Channel Partners will have to deposit an interest free refundable security money of Rs. 3 Lacs in favour of the Registrar, GJUS&T, Hisar in the form of Demand Draft. The said security money is refundable after 6 months after receiving the discontinuation request from the MCP.

**Recommended Clause:**

2. The Marketing Channel Partners will have to deposit an interest free refundable security money of Rs. 3 Lacs in favour of the Registrar, GJUS&T, Hisar in the form of Demand Draft/Net Banking. All the Study Centre of CDOE may be allowed to act as Marketing Channel Partners (MCPs) without security money except private Colleges. Private Colleges have to deposit the refundable security money of Rs. 2 Lacs excluding the already deposited refundable security money of Rs. 1 Lakh for the Study Centre. The said security money is refundable after 6 months after receiving the discontinuation request from the MCP. All associations or Unions etc. of Police, Defence personal and Para Military Forces may be allowed to act as a Marketing Channel Partners without depositing security money. Moreover, all Institutions/Trusts/Boards/Companies etc. with whom the University has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding may be allowed to operate as Marketing Channel Partner without depositing any security money.

**Existing Clause:**

3. Marketing Channel Partners (MCP) will be associated on the basis of incentive (as per given in the Table).

3. Marketing Channel Partners (MCP) will be associated on the basis of incentive (as per given in the Table) from first year fee only:

2.	ODL & Online Mode Degree Programme	45%

However, the Committee is also of the view that total revenue of the University should not decrease because of increase in the fee share of the Marketing Channel Partners (MCP). Therefore, the Committee also propose 20% increase in the tuition fee of all programmes of Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE) for which share of MCP is being increased to 45% as mentioned above.

4. Remaining guidelines will remain same.

**Resolved that the above proposal be deferred.**

**Resolved that the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor be noted and ratified.**

41. **Considered** the appeal dated 18.12.2025 of Smt. Suman, Hostel Care Taker (Annexure-LXXIV Pages 428-431 of the agenda) against office order No. EN-II/2025/12138-47 dated 04.12.2025 whereby she has been dismissed from University Services.

**Resolved that the above proposal be deferred as Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court has stayed the dismissal order.**
