Further the university has applied for NIRF-2017 in three categories: Sciences, Pharmacy and management (Annexure-II).</i></p> <p><i>Five M. Tech programs of the university namely M. Tech CSE, ME, ECE, ESE and PT have been accredited by NBA (Annexure-III).</i></p> <p>The House was updated about NAAC Grading-2014, NIRF-2016 ranking and outcome of NBA-2016. 7.5	To appraise the members about steps taken by the University towards Women Empowerment and "Beti Bachao-Beti Padhao" campaign.
I.	<i>The University has created one additional supernumerary seat in each Department/course of the UGC programmes for a single girl child of her parents or one amongst the only two girl children with no male child for admission to all the UGC courses (except AICTE programmes) being run in the University Teaching departments w.e.f session 2016-17 vide EC resolution no 47, in 71st meeting of Executive council held on 29/12/2015 (Annexure-V).</i>

Maternity Leave to Girl Students:- <i>The University has made a provision for 45 days maternity leave by framing Maternity Leave Rules for the Women Students studying in the University Teaching Departments in the Credit Based System Ordinance vide EC resolution no 48, in 71st meeting of Executive council held on 29/12/2015 (Annexure-VI).</i>
III.	<i>The University has allowed Maternity leave to the contractual teachers w.e.f 22/6/2009 as per government of Haryana Finance department, OM no.11/126/2007-1FR so that all pending cases be finalized accordingly vide EC resolution no 18, in 74th meeting of Executive council held on 9/9/2016. (Annexure-VII).</i>
	All members noted and approved the same. It was also recommended to increase the number from one to two in supernumerary category in each Department/course of the UGC programmes.
7.6	To appraise the members about the Grant received from RUSA, DST Purse and GIAN-MHRD Scheme.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <i>The University has been sanctioned Infrastructure grant of Rs.19.45 crores from MHRD-RUSA.</i> <i>In addition, an amount of Rs.10.46 crores has been sanctioned under DST-PURSE scheme.</i> <i>The Ministry of Human Resources Development (MHRD), Government of India and the University Grants Commission have recognized this university by its admission in GAIN Project which is a prestigious and ambitious scheme for significantly uplifting the quality of teaching learning processes in the institutions of Higher Education in India. In the First phase the university applied for six GIAN programs involving Foreign faculty and three were allotted. In the second phase, the university has applied for 9 more programs under GIAN Project.</i> The House was apprised about these Grants. All members noted and approved the same.

It was unanimously resolved that provision for Lifts be made in Teaching Block III, VI and VII with immediate effect

	and also in rest of Teaching Blocks in phased manner. Also, it was decided that Health Centre will purchase 3-4 Wheel Chairs and will transfer one each in Teaching Block-III, VI and VII. The matter will be referred to Senior Medical Officer and Superintending Engineer for appropriate action.
7.8	To apprise the members about the creation of Public Outreach and Relations Cell of GJUS&T, Hisar.
	<i>The Directorate of Public Outreach has been established for effective branding of the university with Director and official Facebook page, Whatsapp and Twitter account. **UNIVERSITY POLICY REGARDING COMPLIANCE OF
NATIONAL BIODIVERSITY ACT, 2002 AND NATIONAL
BIODIVERSITY RULES, 2004 AT GURU JAMBHESHWAR UNIVERSITY
OF SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY, HISAR**

As per the University Grants Commission , Ministry of Human Resource Development , Govt. of India vide its letter no D.O. No. 14-6/2015 (CPP-II) dated 4th March 2015 all researchers/scientists/ teaching departments have to ensure strict adherence to the provisions of the National Biodiversity Act, 2002 and the National Biodiversity Rules, 2004.

The Act covers conservation, use of biological resources and associated knowledge occurring in India for commercial or research purposes or for the purposes of bio-survey and bio-utilization and provides a framework for access to biological resources and sharing the benefits arising out of such access and use. The Act also includes in its ambit the transfer of research results and application for intellectual property rights (IPRs) relating to Indian biological resources. The Act is applicable to foreigners, non-resident Indians, body corporate, association or organization that is either not incorporated in India or incorporated in India with non-Indian participation in its share capital or management. These individuals or entities require the approval of the National Biodiversity Authority when they use biological resources and associated knowledge occurring in India for commercial or research purposes or for the purposes of bio-survey or bio-utilization.

The Act, therefore, aims at conservation and sustainable use of biological resources and fair and equitable sharing of benefits arising out of the use of these biological resources and associated knowledge. A citizen of India or a body corporate, association or organization which is registered in India can obtain biological resource for commercial utilization, or bio-survey and bio-utilization for commercial utilization only after giving prior intimation to the State Biodiversity Board.

As per the D.O. No. 14-6/2015(CPP-II), dated 9th March, 2015 received from the University Grants Commission, *All staff members, researchers, scientists and students of Guru Jambheshwar University of Science & Technology, its affiliated colleges are required to comply with the provisions of the Act and the Rules made thereunder.*

(1) Some of the important terms defined in the Act are as under:

i) "**Biological Diversity**" means the variability among living organisms from all sources and the ecological complexes of which they are part, and includes diversity within species or between species and of eco-systems.

(ii) "**Biological Resources**" means plants, animals and microorganisms or parts thereof, their genetic material and byproducts (excluding value added products) with actual or potential use or value, but does not include human genetic material.

(iii) "**Bio-survey and Bio-utilization**" means survey or collection of species, sub-species, genes, components and extracts of Biological resource for any purpose and includes characterization, inventorisation and bioassay.

(iv) "**Commercial Utilization**" means end uses of biological resources for commercial utilization such as drugs, industrial enzymes, food flavours, fragrance, cosmetics, emulsifiers, oleoresins, colours, extracts and genes used for improving crop and live stock through genetic intervention but does not include conventional breeding or traditional practices in use in any agriculture, horticulture, poultry, dairy farming, animal husbandry or bee keeping.

(2) Provisions of the Act requiring compliance are as under:

(i) A person who is not a citizen of India or is a non-resident Indian or a body corporate or an association or an organization not incorporated or registered in India or incorporated or registered in India but has non-Indian participation in its share capital and management, is required to seek approval of the National Biodiversity Authority to obtain any biological resource in India or the knowledge associated thereto for research, commercial utilization, bio-survey and bio-utilization.

(ii) A person is required to seek approval of the National Biodiversity Authority to transfer results of any research relating to any biological resources occurring in or obtained from India for monetary consideration or otherwise to any person who is not a citizen of India or is a non-resident Indian or a body corporate or an organization which is not registered or incorporated in India or which has non Indian participation in its share capital or management.

Transfer of results of research does not include publication of research paper or dissemination of knowledge in any seminar or workshop, if such publication is as per the guidelines issued by the Central Government.

Approvals as mentioned in Clauses (i) and (ii) above are not required for collaborative research projects involving transfer or exchange of biological resources or information relating thereto between institutions, including government sponsored institutions of India, and institutions in

other countries, if such collaborative research projects conform to the policy guidelines issued by the Central Government in that behalf and are approved by the Central Government.

(iii) A person is required to seek approval of the National Biodiversity Authority before applying for any Intellectual Property Right, by whatever name called, in or outside India for any invention based on any research or information on a biological resource obtained from India. However, if a person applies for a patent, permission of the National Biodiversity Authority may be obtained after the acceptance of the patent but before sealing of the patent by the patent authority concerned.

(iv) A person who is a citizen of India or a body corporate or an association or an organization registered in India shall give prior intimation to the State Biodiversity Board before obtaining any biological resource for commercial utilization or bio-survey and bio-utilization for commercial utilization.

(3) **Right to appeal:** Any person, aggrieved by any determination of benefit sharing or order of the National Biodiversity Authority or a State Biodiversity Authority, may file an appeal to the High Court within thirty days from the date of communication of such order to him.

(4) **Consequences of lack of compliance with the Act:**

In cases where an approval of the National Biodiversity Authority/ State Biodiversity Board is required for the use of Indian biological resources and associated knowledge and such approval is not obtained, he/she is liable to punishment/fine or both as per provisions of the Act/ state rules applicable at that time.

(5) **Forms of application, manner of making applications and payment of fees are prescribed in the Biological Diversity Rules, 2004. Details of these forms are as under:**

- (i) Form I: Application for access to biological resources and associated traditional knowledge;
- (ii) Form II: Application for seeking prior approval of the National Biodiversity Authority for transferring the results of research to foreign nationals, companies, non-resident Indians, for commercial purposes;
- (iii) Form III: Application for seeking prior approval of the National Biodiversity Authority for applying for Intellectual Property Right;
- (iv) Form IV: Application for seeking approval of the National Biodiversity Authority for third party transfer of the accessed biological resources and associated traditional knowledge.

In such cases, she will not be required to pay the re-admission fee and the entire semester fee (if she has already paid the drop out semester fee) to complete the attendance of the drop out semester.

Disability Resource Center at GJUST, Hisar.**

A meeting of the following was held on 15-2-2017 at 4:30 PM in the office of Director (IQAC) for setting up of Disability resource Center at GJUST, Hisar. Following members were present:

- 2) Prof. Neeraj Dilbaghi, Director (IQAC)
- 3) Sh. Manoj Yadav, Dept. of CSE

Reference to the D.O. received from AICTE vide No: 7-2/DD-Admin. /MHRD /2012/2768 Dt Feb 24, 2016, Disability Resource Centers should be set up in all Universities/ Colleges to facilitate Quality education to the students with disabilities on equal basis with others. The guidelines have to be implemented to make all Universities / Colleges accessible to persons with disabilities.

The students under this category may be having physical disability i.e. orthopedic, visual / hearing impairment or learning disability i.e. dyslexia or mental health difficulty like depression. Generally these students do not need any specific provisions other than those required by able students for learning. But it has been observed that in many cases, students are unable to cope up their academic learning with normal students. They are sometimes slow in completion in their assignments, project and laboratory work etc. After regular class hours mentoring and help is needed. Therefore providing them support becomes essential so that they are not left behind.

It is proposed to set up Disability Resource Center at Guru Jambheshwar University of Science & Technology, Hisar. The following shall act as office bearers:

- 1) Prof. Shabnam Saxena, HSB (Coordinator)
- 2) Prof. Sujata Sanghi, Dept of Applied Physics.
- 3) Prof. Sandeep Rana, Dept of Applied Psychology
- 4) Prof. Vikram Kaushik, Dept of CMT
- 5) Sh Mukesh Kumar, Head UCIC & Nodal officer Statistical Cell
- 6) Dr. Vinod Kumar, Deputy Librarian
- 7) Sh Manoj Malik, Department of Physiotherapy
- 8) Sh. Manoj Yadav, Dept. of CSE
- 9) Er. Sunil Grover, Executive Engineer (Civil)
- 10) Dr Lokesh Jindal, Medical Officer

The Center will provide following facilities:

- A) Database:** Centre shall maintain data regarding disabilities of the students.

B) Advisory service: Considering the requirements of students, centre can suggest use of Institute facilities so as to provide accessibility. Centre can keep all concerned informed about the issues to make them understand difficulties that need to be addressed well in time to avoid crisis situations.

C) Training: Conduct workshops for instructors and student mentors (academic assistants) to create awareness about various disabilities and ways to handle the same.

D) Documentation: Create documents to make the students aware of the facilities available for such students.

The Specific and General Guidelines proposed for Disability Resource Centre are as under:

Foremost requirement for all categories of disabled students is barrier free environment and special pedagogical approaches. **Following are some of the ways in which the centre can support the students' to improve overall learning effectiveness.**

I) For students with learning difficulty (Dyslexia, Dyspraxia, Dyscalculia, Disgraphia)

- Make available recorded sessions, digital presentations
- Allow students to record during sessions
- Provide reading material in advance of lectures
- Provide book bank services
- Extended loan period for library books
- Extended time for writing examinations, conducting practicals / workshop practice
- Extended timeline for submissions
- Arrange mentorship through senior students
- Additional support (writer) during examination

II) For students with mental health difficulty (depression, anxiety, schizophrenia etc)

- Provide clear information about the course requirements and deadlines well in advance
- Suggest and provide services of counselor
- Extended timeline for submissions
- Regular meetings to discuss problems and keeping in touch
- Allow breaks / absence for short periods
- Maintain record in confidence of medication, allergies, sensitivity

III) For students with hearing impairment

- Provide all information including feedback if any, in written format
- Make available recorded sessions, digital presentations
- Computer having suitable audio hardware and software
- Provide reading material in advance of lectures

- Allow students to record during sessions
- Reserve Seating in class to ensure good communication
- Have subtitles in any presentation involving visual media
- Use of sign language interpreter
- Use of assistive technology like listening devices with enhanced sound level, high quality sound transmission device, videos with sign language interpretation, speech to print transcription systems

IV) For students with visual impairment


- Provide all information including feedback if any, in accessible written format along with oral explanation
- Computers having suitable screens, reading software
- Provide reading material in accessible format in advance of lectures
- Allow students to record during sessions
- Reserve seating in class to ensure good visibility of presentations
- Regular meetings with instructors to ensure support is effective
- Provide human support in certain outdoor activities
- Use of assistive technology like large print & Braille conversion tools, desktop magnifiers, backlit keyboards, optical magnifiers

V) For students with physical impairment (mobility, manual dexterity, speech difficulty)

- Allow students to record during sessions
- Reserve seating in class to ensure accessibility
- Allow breaks during practical's
- Extended time for writing examinations, conducting practical's/ workshop practice
- Extended timeline for submissions
- Use of assistive technology like alternate hardware devices

General Guidelines

- Provide accessibility to classrooms, laboratories and examination centers
- provide accessibility to common facilities canteen, toilets
- Provide suitable signage
- Provide details of facilities on website, admission brochures

Baljit Singh as Chief Security Officer on contract basis for a period of six months w.e.f 16.8.2016, as recommended by the Constituted Committee in its meeting held on 22nd July 2016, on the following terms and conditions:-

1. That he **will** be paid consolidated salary of Rs 40,000/- per month from the contingency budget head of Security Office.
2. That his appointment will be purely on temporary basis and **will not** entitle any type of benefits which accrue to regular University employees.
3. That he **will not** be entitled to Provident Fund, Gratuity, Earned Leave, Medical Leave and any other kind of leave except Casual Leave, which will be permissible to as per the rules of the University.
4. That his services may be terminated at any time without prior notice without assigning any reason.
5. That he **will not** be entitled to claim regularization or regular pay scale or any other service benefits whatsoever for which the University employees are entitled.
6. That he **will** be entitled TA/DA for undertaking journey on University work in accordance with the last pay drawn.
7. That he **will** work under the control of Proctor.

Resolved that the above proposal be approved. Further resolved that Lt. Col. (Retd.) Baljit Singh will report to the Proctor for day to day functioning.

10. **Considered** the recommendations of the "Medical Committee" in its meeting held on 11-07-2016 for empanelment of the private Doctors/Hospitals located in the city of Hisar for including in the list of empanelled hospitals of the University (Annexure-III Pages 34-35 of the agenda).

Resolved that the above proposal be approved.

11. **Noted** the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor, in anticipation of approval of the Executive Council, in extending the deputation period of Mrs. Sakshi Dhingra, Assistant Professor, Department of Computer Science & Engg. from 19.08.2016 to 18.08.2017 who has joined the Chaudhary Devi Lal University, Sirsa.

Resolved that the above proposal be approved.

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16. **Noted** the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor in approving the case for engagement of M/s Avinash Khosla & Associates, # 568-A1, Police House Link Road, Near Fountain Chowk, Civil Lines, Ludhiana as Architect-Consultant for construction of Buildings for a period of two years w.e.f. 22.01.2016 as conveyed vide letter No. SE/16/2123 dated 22.01.2016.

Resolved that the above proposal be approved.

17. **Noted** the action taken by the Vice Chancellor under section 11(5) of the University Act in anticipation of approval of the Executive Council on the following issues:-

1. That one post each of Associate Professor and Assistant Professor sanctioned for the Deptt. of Advertising Management & Public Relations, which has now been merged in the Deptt. of CMT, may be temporarily transferred to the Directorate of Distance Education for the courses of Mass Communication and Mathematics being run through Distance Education Mode.
2. The post of Associate Professor may be filled at the level of Assistant Professor.

Resolved that the above proposal be approved with the amendment that the word "temporarily" be deleted from the agenda item.

18. **Considered** the date of grant of Maternity leave to the contractual teachers of the university w.e.f 22.06.2009 i.e date on which the instructions issued by the State Govt. or w.e.f 26.03.2010 i.e the date on which the said instructions of the State Govt. have been approved by the Executive Council so that all such cases pending may be finalized accordingly.

Resolved that the above proposal be approved w.e.f. 22.06.2009.

19. **Considered** the case of extension in Extra Ordinary Leave(without pay) to Dr. Manoj Kumar, Assistant Professor, Department of Electronics & Communication Engineering for a period of six months i.e. from 01.09.2016 to 28.02.2017.

Resolved that the above proposal be approved.

20. **Considered** the recommendations of the committee for implementation of five days week working for the teaching staff of Guru Jambheshwar University of Science & Technology, Hisar.

Resolved that the above proposal be approved w.e.f. next year i.e. January, 2017 to facilitate the research work for the teaching staff of University Campus only.
